Letter from our minister



Hopefully you have noticed the window display here at South Wigston Methodist of an exhibition called “Wondering Soul” which is taking place at another church in the Circuit – Bishop Street Methodist Church in Town Hall Square LE1 6AF - during May and early June. The exhibition of 45 works from the Methodist Modern Art Collection will also take place at the cathedral and at St Andrews and St Nicholas churches. Many people don’t realise that the Methodist Church has a modern art collection which was started by a legacy in the 1960’s. There are paintings by well-known artists such as Elizabeth Frinck, Graham Sutherland, and Mark Cazalet, and outside the Vatican it is one of the world’s largest collections of modern art inspired by the life, death, and resurrection of Christ.

Modern art may not be your thing, but as well as being able (for free) to look at the paintings in the four venues, you can attend workshops or talks which may help you get a better feel for some of the paintings. There are also response and prayer stations at each venue, such as a lego-based and mill-stone response. You can listen to music surrounded by the paintings, you can go on a day retreat, or attend a photography or printing workshop. You can hear local preachers, Dr Miriam Stevenson and Richard Gill speak about the history of art and how this relates to Methodism. There’s a Messy Church for families with young children at the cathedral, and a bank holiday picnic, inspired by one of the paintings.

For those who would be interested to become more involved, there's a request for volunteers to be "invigilators" for the paintings, or there's a prayer diary to encourage people to pray for the effect of the paintings on people coming to see them. You can register for both these roles on www.wonderingsoul.co.uk Look forward to seeing you there.



