## Letter from our minister



Around the time of the new millennium, the Methodist Church came out with “Our Calling” as Methodists in four areas of: worship, evangelism, service, learning and caring. The Church last year reaffirmed “Our Calling” as helpful guidance for the Church’s direction, so at the annual General Church Meeting on 19<sup>th</sup> May this year, those present at the morning service reflected on these four areas. Here is a summary of those reflections, helping guide South Wigston Methodist Church in its next steps:

### **Service:**

Many church members are involved in charities. Through the Local Worship Team services on the last Sunday of the month, we share with one another our concerns about things which do not seem right, or cause trouble in our community, or appear unjust, including global concerns.

We use the church premises for Saturday coffee mornings, when local community members are welcomed. There is limited capacity to host other groups and activities. We need to pray more for the community, and the church could benefit from prayers for healing.

### **Worship:**

More spontaneous thanksgiving could be included in some services. Informal communion services are appreciated, as well as music during communion.

A photocopied order of service would help visitors and members. (All of these suggestions are being worked on...)

## **Learning and Caring:**

There are lots of small groups which are accessible and friendly to help deepen our faith in God and link faith to everyday life, such as the Lent Group, and the Bible Breakfast on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of every month at 8.45am. (Resumes 15<sup>th</sup> September.) Groups like Little Angels, Knit and Natter, and Girls Brigade make it easy for others to join us, though we note with sadness the closure of Little Angels after an amazing 20 years. We would like to have more contact with the Male Voice Choir. (Beryl and Fran enjoyed their latest concert. The next Prom concert is 6<sup>th</sup> July.)

If someone isn't a regular attender it can be difficult to know when they are in need of pastoral contact, so please be in touch with your pastoral visitor or Fran if you would like a visit.

**Evangelism:** There are friendly, kind attitudes at the church, and it is a very welcoming and warm atmosphere, however both front doors could be opened onto the street to demonstrate this, especially in warmer weather.

"I wish I had faith" is a comment that is heard, and in response to this a sensitive, genuine approach is best. We can offer prayers for others seeking faith, and we should use clear, straightforward, meaningful words, always being ready to express our faith in words (1 Peter 3:15).

The latest Compassion newsletter focussed on the neighbouring country of Togo and included this recipe for Chicken peanut stew.

8 chicken thighs (vegetarians can substitute sweet potato)  
1 large onion, chopped  
1-2 cloves garlic, crushed  
2 medium tomatoes, chopped  
1 chicken or vegetable stock cube  
1 cup of peanut butter  
2 tbs tomato puree  
Salt & pepper to taste  
2 cups water

Season the chicken with salt & pepper.

Add 1 tbsp of oil to a large frying pan or casserole and brown the chicken.

Add the onion and garlic and fry until soft.

Meanwhile, put the peanut butter, tomatoes, tomato puree and water in a blender. Blend until you have a fine paste.

Stir the paste into the chicken and leave on a low heat, stirring occasionally – about 30-40 minutes – for the sauce to reduce & thicken. Check that the chicken is cooked before serving.

In Togo this is often served with the staple dish – maize porridge.
