Scripture in the kitchen ~ David's Blessed Buns

A recipe from the Bible Society's Beth Read (Reprinted with permission.)

And when David had finished offering the burnt offerings and the peace offerings, he blessed the people in the name of the Lord of hosts. Then he distributed among the people, the whole multitude of Israel, both men and women, a cake of bread, a portion of meat, and a cake of raisins to each one. Then all the people departed, each to his own house. 2 Samuel 6.18-19 (ESV)

Ingredients

100g brown sugar 200ml warm water

1tbsp yeast 100g plain flour

1tsp butter 100g raisins

Salt and your choice of spices such as ginger, cinnamon, almond essence or mixed spice.

1 tbsp honey (optional)

Method - makes 8

- 1. Mix the sugar, yeast and water together and leave in a warm place for 30 minutes, so that the yeast can start to activate.
- 2. Stir in the flour and butter and knead for 5 minutes.
- 3. Add your choice of spices and flavourings and then knead and shape into 8 round buns.
- 4. Place on a greased tray and bake in the oven at Gas 6 (200° C) for 20 minutes until risen and a nice colour.

5. Lovely toasted with butter while reading or singing your favourite psalms.
