East Midlands in Bloom at Aigburth

Marilyn Bowles (head volunteer gardener) writes: For those of you who have shown an interest in the 'East Midlands in Bloom' project where MHA Aigburth Garden was <u>part of</u> the Pride of the Borough, Oadby and Wigston entry judging route in July, I am very pleased to announce that they/we won the Gold Award. The comments about our garden in the judges' report:

Horticulture

'The beautiful garden at Aigburth MHA Residential and Dementia Care Home continues to flourish with new ideas added this year. The volunteer gardeners have experimented successfully with planting a dry bank under trees, with erigeron and loosestrife doing particularly well. The needs of the residents are at the heart of the garden and there is a trolley of scented plants to prompt memories and appeal to the senses'.

Environment

'The garden at MHA Aigburth has been greatly enhanced by the addition of a pond. A recent moth survey in the garden resulted in up to 300 moths being collected with 46 different species amongst them. The information is to be uploaded onto the Nature Spot database for Leicestershire and Rutland. There was also a lot of interest from residents in solitary bees happily living between paving slabs! A Nature Hub summerhouse has attracted interest and features some lovely bird drawings by visiting relatives.'

Saying Goodbye, (part of the Mariposa Trust) are coming to Derby in October with a very special Baby loss remembrance and support service (part of a UK and Ireland chain of events). This will be even more



poignant as it comes at the start of Baby Loss Awareness Week.

The Mariposa Trust's core objective is to support people who have lost babies at any stage of pregnancy, at birth, or in infancy. It was founded in 2012, by Zoe and Andy Clark-Coates, who saw a critical lack of support for people like them, who had gone through baby loss. With over 258,000 babies being lost yearly in the UK alone, the charity needed to be able to offer not only a comprehensive package of befriending and support but also national loss remembrance services (called Saying Goodbye Services), people to join together and remember the children they had lost. 5 years on, over 150 services have taken place at Cathedrals and Minsters across the UK, US, and France, and 2023 will see 21 services across England, Wales, Scotland and Ireland.

On the 21st October at 11am, in Derby Cathedral, Derby we will be hosting one of our Saying Goodbye Services and as this is the most local service to you this year we wanted to share this information with you.

So who is the service for?

Anyone who has either personally lost a baby at any stage of pregnancy, at birth, or in early years, or who has been affected by family members' or friends' loss. Whether the loss was recent or 80 years ago, everyone is welcome to attend. We have also extended the services, and gladly welcome anyone who is grieving the fact that they haven't had children. This may be due to circumstance, infertility, or for other reasons - but all are welcome. Babies and children are also invited to come with their families, as the Saying Goodbye service is truly a family event for all.

We know that as 1 in 4 women suffer miscarriage and baby loss, you will have contact with a significant number of people who have either personally suffered baby loss, or who have a partner or family member that has, so we wanted to ask if you would help us in promoting the service.

Why support the Link to Hope Shoebox Appeal 2023?

We ask people to join in with our Shoebox Appeal 2023 and fill a Shoebox for a family – not just a child. The list contains items for all family members and includes different items. These range from shower gel/shampoo, family games, stationary items, gift for mum and dad as well as sweets, soft toys, hats, scarves etc

Our Shoebox Appeal has been running since 1992. We have delivered smiles to thousands of people in Eastern Europe over the years. In fact, we have sent in total over 1,000,000 shoeboxes to hundreds of different locations!

What makes this Christmas Shoebox Appeal different?

- 1. Delivering Christmas shoeboxes to homes helps our project workers identify emergencies, and address them. For example:
 - Maria, aged 74, was found sleeping on the dirt floor of her freezing home. Seeing her need, Link to Hope also delivered a bed, blankets and pillows to Maria.
 - A Christmas shoebox was delivered to a family grieving for their baby, who had died from cold because they had no money to heat the one room they all lived in. Link to Hope supporters raised enough funds to rehouse the family in a purpose-built container home.
- 2. This Christmas Shoebox Appeal collects boxes for entire families and the elderly, so nobody's left out.
- 3. We are small, yet established enough to have personal relationships with the individuals in Eastern Europe who work hard delivering your boxes. For transparency, we also conduct spot-checks to confirm that the right people are receiving your boxes.
